Measure U Ballot Question:

“Shall the City of Colton adopt an ordinance enacting a tax on cannabis businesses of up to \$25 per square foot of space utilized for cannabis cultivation/processing, and up to 10% of gross receipts from the sale of cannabis and related products, generating approximately \$2,100,000 annually for general City services, such as police and emergency response, parks & youth/senior services, and other essential services, until ended by voters?”

Measure U – Defined:

Measure U is a ballot measure on the November 6th General Election ballot for City of Colton voters ONLY. Measure U asks voters to impose a tax on cannabis/marijuana businesses operating in the City. It does not amend the City’s existing cannabis regulations or authorize new or additional types of cannabis businesses to operate in the City.

If approved, Measure U would impose a maximum tax rate on cannabis businesses of up to \$25 per square foot of space used for cannabis cultivation and/or processing, and up to 10% of gross receipts from the sale of cannabis or cannabis products.

What will Measure U do?

Measure U does not expand or change cannabis businesses in Colton. Rather, Measure U is a tax on cannabis businesses operating in Colton. It is not a tax on Colton residents or non-cannabis businesses. If passed, Measure U revenues would help pay for additional general City services to mitigate the impacts of cannabis in the City of Colton.

Measure U :

- ⇒ Helps provide the City of Colton revenue from the cannabis industry to pay for the impacts of cannabis in our community
- ⇒ Provides additional funds for public safety services, like police & fire
- ⇒ Funds could be used towards parks, library and recreation services.

As a Business Tax and not a Sales Tax,
all Measure U funds stay in Colton.
